BACKFLOW-PREVENTION

The Texas Commission in Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requires all public water systems to maintain a cross-connection control program that protects the distribution system delivering drinking water to your home or business.

What is cross-connection?

A physical connection between potable (drinking) water and an actual or potential contamination hazard that could make the water unsafe to drink. Wherever there is a cross-connection, there is a potential threat to public health from contaminants.

How can backflow be prevented?

Backflow into a potable-water system can be prevented by using a backflow-prevention assembly, or an air gap, which is a physical separation between the water supply and a potential source of pollution. Licensed professionals, as well as Public Works staff, are responsible for determining the type of backflow-prevention assembly required, based on the degree of hazard.

Common residential cross-connections:

Garden hose:

Backflow can occur at your home if you leave a garden hose turned on submerged in a swimming pool, inserted into your car's radiator to flush out the antifreeze, or attach it to an insecticide sprayer. That material could siphon back into your potable water.

Lawn sprinkler system:

Regulations by the TCEQ require that all lawn sprinkler systems are connected through a backflow-prevention assembly.

Testing backflow-prevention assemblies

Because backflow-prevention assemblies are mechanical assemblies that can fail, the TCEQ requires testing all backflow-prevention assemblies at installation by a TCEQ-licensed tester. Backflow-prevention assemblies installed to protect against any health hazard must be tested annually.

Backflow & Cross Connection Alert

Per City Ordinance 2016-005, all backflow devices in the City need to be tested regularly. If the City has not notified you, please contact the Public Works department for more information on your responsibilities.

Common cross-connections at commercial/institutional locations:

- Fire Sprinkler Systems
- Irrigation Systems
- Beverage systems using CO2 tanks (carbonated drink dispensers)
- Dishwashers
- Icemakers
- Coffee machines
- Steam cooking systems
- Preparation areas
- Water fountains
- Swimming pools, saunas, Jacuzzis, whirlpools

Commercial & Institutional facilities that typically require backflow prevention:

- Auto repair, body shops
- Health Clubs & Spas
- Restaurants and Clubs
- Beauty, Barbers & Nail Salons
- Commercial Laundries
- Medical Facilities
