2021 FY BUDGET

It has been said that a City's operating budget is the most critical policy document that a city adopts in any given year. On September 14th, the City Council adopted a balanced budget of several hundred thousand dollars less than the prior year's budget. Council also approved a tax rate of \$0.5233, similar to the 2016 rate of \$0.5213. The new tax rate allows for a substantial investment in the quality of life for the citizens of Castroville through the commitment of capital improvements for roads, parks, and drainage improvements over the coming years.

It is exciting to work with the elected officials and help them identify and fund significant capital improvements. 2022 will be a year of change as the City begins a multi-year commitment to fix the broken streets, invest in Parks improvements, and partner with a dedicated group of people to restore and rejuvenate the historic downtown district. The Council is also working with staff to adjust the City's utility rates so that Castroville can finally address the water leaks and pressure issues and better prepare the system for cold weather so that we don't experience what happened this past February ever again.

Tips for Trick or Treating Safety



Safety Tips for Motorists

- Watch for children walking on roadways, medians, and curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully.
- At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing.
- Discourage new, inexperienced drivers from driving on Halloween.

Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Look left, right, and left again when crossing, and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
