Elvie Stein was born on April 28, 1892 in Cliff (San Geronimo) to Joseph Haby and Josephine Schott. She has lived in the rural area north of Castroville all her life. Born and reared at "Cliff", she moved to Rio Medina when she married Alfred Stein. She is now eighty-eight and tells about the life in the early days with her family.
