PREFACE

This file is the product of a tape-recorded interview conducted by the Castroville Public Library Oral History Project B. Madeline Boubel conducted the interview in the home of the narrator in Castroville on November 19, 1980.

Florence Tschirhart was born and reared one mile north of Castroville. Her parents were Edward Lamon and Josephine Keller. Her mother died when Florence was thirteen years old, and she helped raise two small brothers. The Lamons raised most of their food and supplemented their income with the pecan crops and selling their fruit and vegetables, and eggs.

In 1930, Florence married Howard Tschirhart, a barber. They lived most of their married life in Castroville, Florence clerking at several stores in town. This second interview done with Florence covers life as it was in Castroville in the early part of this century.
