PREFACE

This file is the product of a tape-recorded interview conducted by the Castroville Public Library Oral History Project B. Connie Rihn conducted the interview at the home of the narrator, a ranch about two miles east of Castroville, on June 24, 1981.

Cecile Jagge was born in 1890 in D'Hanis, Texas. Her parents, Frank and Lena Poerner, were German immigrants. Cecile was the youngest of five children of her father's second marriage. Her mother died when she was very young, and Cecile was raised by her father and older sister. She received her schooling at the Seco rural school, one year at the D'Hanis Catholic School, and when she was fourteen she attended the Sister's boarding school in Castroville for one year. She married Fred Jagge of Castroville, and they moved to his ranch, where she has lived ever since. Fred died in ____.

Cecile has worked hard all her life, helping her husband with the farming and ranching. They had someone living with them most of their married life. Their daughter, Freddie married Floyd Haby and they with their two daughters, lived with the Jagges for several years. At ninety, Cecile is still in good health and does her own housework. She enjoys watching television and playing cards with her friends.
