



NEW DROUGHT SURCHARGE

We are in the worst drought in 70 years, and the second worst in recorded history. While the city is well prepared with a slight surplus of water to deal with situations like this, it is our responsibility as a community to reduce our water consumption and ensure there is plenty for everyone.

Not everyone takes this responsibility to heart, so we are implementing a surcharge only for the excessive users of water. For residences, this will only impact those who ignore the pleas to conserve and continue to waste. For our businesses, we will have exceptions in place for those who must consume additional water for justifiable reasons (for example, assisted living or nursing homes, etc.) and we encourage other businesses to implement water savings measures during this extreme drought.

For every 1,000 gallons used above the thresholds shown above, a \$7.89 charge will be levied.

Watch Your Water Consumption: Winter Averaging Begins with November 10th Bill

Conserving water during the months of October thru January can lower your monthly sewer charge!

What is Winter Averaging?

Winter averaging is a method developed to give you the best possible break on sewer billing cost. This method takes the water consumption used during the meter readings cycles from October (November bill) to January (February bill) as the basis for billing sewer charges throughout the year. We eliminate the highest of the four months, then average the remaining three months to determine how the rate will be calculated.

We use winter averaging to determine each individual resident's rate. This rate will begin on the March 10, 2024, bill and will be your rate through February 10, 2025, bill.

If you watch your water consumption/usage, then you can reduce your sewer bill.

MAYORS REPORT ON EQUIPMENT THEFTS



Don't let your lawnmower go on a unplanned adventure! Lock it up, or it might mow someone else's lawn!!

Recently, the Castroville Police Department has been investigating a series of lawnmower and tool thefts in town. Thanks to vigilant citizens reporting suspicious activities and thorough police work, a significant breakthrough was achieved.

After an initial theft, a person of interest was identified, but there wasn't enough evidence to charge them. Castroville Police Detectives worked with additional details for local residents to drill in to identify who might be responsible.

Castroville PD worked with other cities to identify the potential suspect and were able to identify a likely suspect and where that suspect was selling the stolen items. With this evidence, our Castroville detective secured an arrest warrant for felony theft, as the suspect had prior theft convictions. After about a week of searching, the police located and arrested the suspect at their residence. The suspect had made over 60 pawn transactions in just five months.

How can you protect your property?

To prevent future thefts, the Castroville Police Department urges everyone to secure their property behind enclosures and to record serial numbers of valuable items. This information can be crucial in recovering stolen property, as businesses do not typically log serial numbers when selling items.

By working together, we can help protect our community and keep it safe.

Another way to help identify your property if it is stolen is to etch your drivers license number onto your property. **DO NOT** put your social security, phone number, or address onto the tools because that information can be used to scam you in the future. You can use any unique identifiers that don't put you at risk for scams but will help our officers to identify your property if it is stolen.

Stay Vigilant! If you see something, say something. Always report stolen property, even if it's minor.



Community Workshop Notification

THE CITY OF CASTROVILLE IS HOLDING A HEARING THAT WILL DETERMINE WHETHER YOU MAY LOSE THE RIGHT TO CONTINUE USING YOUR PROPERTY FOR ITS CURRENT USE. PLEASE READ THIS NOTICE CAREFULLY.

The City of Castroville is updating its Code of Ordinances to ensure Castroville remains Castroville and to create alignment with our policies and development standards for the future. The change in ordinances includes a new zoning ordinance called the Place Type Zoning Ordinance. **This modification to the Code of Ordinances requires a translation from existing zoning districts to the Unified Development Ordinance.**

The City of Castroville is hosting a community workshop to discuss these ordinance changes on December 10th, from 3:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Landmark Inn. The Castroville Planning and Zoning Commission is hosting a workshop to discuss these ordinance changes with policy makers on December 11th, from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at City Hall Council Chambers. Members of the public are invited to attend both the workshop and public hearing.
