Watch your water consumption: Winter Averaging Begins with November 10th bill

Conserving water during the months of October thru January can lower your monthly sewer charge!

What is winter averaging?

Winter averaging is a method developed to give you the best possible break on sewer billing cost. This method takes the water consumption used during the meter reading cycles from *October (November bill) to January (February bill)* as the basis for billing sewer charges throughout the year. We eliminate the highest of the four months, then average the remaining three months to determine how the rate will be calculated.

We use winter averaging to determine each individual resident's rate. This rate will begin on the March 10, 2024, bill and will be your rate through February 10, 2025, bill.

If you watch your water consumption/usage, then you can reduce your sewer bill.


If you're expecting packages, arrange for delivery to a secure location or a package locker.


- Be mindful of cold weather. Be sure to bring in pets or have adequate shelter when temperatures dip low.


FRIENDS OF THE PARK MEETING NOTICE

Did the Letter About Zoning Changes Worry or upset you too? Lets Clear Things Up.

Hello neighbors,

I wanted to take a moment to address a letter many of you may have received recently about the upcoming changes to our city's zoning ordinances. The letter includes language that is required by Texas State Law:

"The City of Castroville is holding a hearing that will determine whether you may lose the right to continue using your property for its current use. Please read this notice carefully."

I know that wording sounds alarming, and I acknowledge that it can be downright infuriating, but Texas State law does require it (see Sec. 211.006. of Local Government Code). The good news is that none of the proposed changes will reduce your rights or uses currently allowed under our existing code. Another concern I heard was that people were worried their neighboring city lots might be developed into apartments or other uses that could disrupt their peaceful living; however, this is not being considered.

So, what **IS** happening? The City of Castroville is modernizing its ordinances, as we must do regularly, but with the goal of keeping Castroville true to itself while planning thoughtfully for our future.

What is **NOT** happening? In the face of all the people and companies who are trying to build in Castroville, I and your city council want to ensure we don't ruin the integrity of this city and turn it into "anywhere USA" – which is harder and harder as our State Legislature continues to erode our ability to control that. What I hear most often from nearly everyone in Castroville is, "Don't change my city, my neighborhood, and definitely not the area around me." Your city staff and council are dedicated to using every legally available method to control this and are working to align our city codes with the way the city currently exists. To do this well, we need your input.

To make sure everyone has a chance to learn about these updates and discuss the challenges, we're hosting two more public events this month:

- Community Workshop: December 10th, 3:00–8:00 p.m. at the Landmark Inn
- Planning & Zoning Commission Workshop: December 11th, 6:30–8:00 p.m. at City Hall in Council Chambers
