CASTROVILLE COMMUNITY CENTER UPDATE

The long-awaited Castroville Community Center at Regional Park is officially moving forward, bringing us one step closer to a vibrant new space. After years of careful planning and coordination, we are thrilled to announce that the pre-construction kick-off meeting will take place on March 6, 2025, at the USDA Regional Office in Seguin, TX. Following this meeting, construction is set to begin within four to six weeks, with completion scheduled for April 2026.

This multi-purpose facility will serve as a hub for community gatherings, recreational activities, and public events, enriching the quality of life for all Castroville residents. The project's journey has been one of persistence and dedication, ensuring that every step meets regulatory and financial requirements.

With a \$1.7 million reimbursement grant awarded to the City of Castroville in January 2023, this project was a significant investment into our community. Additionally, the City of Castroville has committed over \$400,000 from its general fund reserves to ensure the project moves forward smoothly until completion.

In June 2024, City Council awarded the construction contract to Frontera Construction for \$1,950,000 reinforcing our commitment to bringing this much-needed facility to our residents while carefully managing project costs.

A Timeline of Progress

- Early 2021: Initial planning for the community center began.
- March 2022: The City sought congressional funding with Congressman Tony Gonzales.
- January 2023: The City secured \$1.7 million in federal funding
- February 2023 – Present: City staff worked closely with the USDA, following detailed steps including environmental inspections, public notices, and contracting with engineers and architects.
- August 2023: City Council selected LPA as the project's architect/engineer.
- September 2023: The final building design was approved.
- October 2023 – January 2024: The project was advertised for bids twice due to only receiving one initial bid.
- April 2024: The existing pool building was demolished to make way for the new construction.

- June 11, 2024: City Council awarded the construction contract to Frontera Construction for the amount of \$1,950,000.
- June 14, 2024: The USDA issued a Letter of Conditions, introducing additional unforeseen requirements that delayed the start of construction.

Despite the unanticipated delays, City staff has worked tirelessly alongside LPA, Frontera Construction, the USDA, and various consultants to meet the necessary requirements to keep the project moving forward. The USDA has explained that its agency had been working to reduce project requirements nationwide since 2021, but an internal miscommunication resulted in the additional, unforeseen requirements for the City's project, causing the delay.

Thankfully, all these challenges have now been resolved, and we are full steam ahead towards groundbreaking. We know the anticipation has been building, and we appreciate your patience as we navigate this process. Castroville is on its way to having a fantastic new community space that will serve generations to come!
