Public Works Pointer how to catch a leaky toilet

Toilet leaks are one of the most common -- and most unnoticed -- sources of wasted water in a home. Many leaks are silent, which means you might not even realize they're happening until your water bill starts creeping up.



Here's a simple test you can do: Drop a dye tablet, tea bag, or a few drops of food coloring into the tank (that's the top part of the toilet). Don't flush -- and just wait 10 -15 minutes.

If color shows up in the bowl, you've got a silent leak! Fixing it is usually easy and inexpensive -- often just a worn-out flapper. A quick fix today could save hundreds of gallons of water (and money!) over time.

What To Do In Case of a Natural Gas Leak

Don't --

- Operate anything electronic or light a flame
- Turn on or off the lights
- Use the telephone
- Turn on or off the television or radio
- Turn on or off the a flashlight
- Turn on the gas range or other gas appliance
- Strike a match
- Open an automatic garage door

Do --

- Exit the building immediately
- Leave the door open on the way out
- Leave the area immediately if you're outside
- Go to another place and the call the fire department or gas company to report the leak
- Stay away until someone from the fire department, gas company, or emergency area says it is safe to return.
